Association and it's role in organizing various Co-curricular Activities which will help them function better.



Under the guidance of Mr. Pinak Dey(Program Officer), National Service Scheme Unit II of Salesian College Siliguri successfully completed their first industrial visit for session 2021-2022 on 27th October, 2021. The area of visit was Industrial Sector-1, near Sachitra Hotel Siliguri. The main motive of the survey was to understand the mechanical as well as worker related subject of the industries through closer view.

All volunteers(24) gathered in the Killian Hall at 12:10 pm and were led into a short prayer by Fr. Jagjeevan Tirkey. All volunteers were briefed about the event and were asked to maintain decorum while in the industrial area by the Program Officer and Senior Volunteers.



At 12:30pm volunteers left the college campus and headed towards the sector. Two modes of transportation was used i.e., private and public. We reached the area at 1pm and started our survey. We covered four industries of that sector namely,

- 1) Hypro Soyabean Industry
- 2) Sun Prints
- 3) Khusboo Plastic Industry
- 4) Sarkar Tiles Industry

The first industry we visited was Hypro Soyabean Industry. It was established in the year 1986 by Mr. Joginder Kejriwal and is currently run by Mr. Rahul Kejriwal. There are total of 6-7 workers who are paid on the basis of their work efficiency. The raw material(soya grits) are brought from Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Maharashtra. The waste generated from the factory is used for the production of cattle feed. All the workers have been vaccinated and are kept in a




safe working environment.

The second industry that we visited was Sun Prints. The printing press has been running for 15 years under Mr R.K Agarwal(founder) and Mr. Arnav Agarwal. The factory produces posters, billboards, banners, vinyl posters, magazines etc. Various machines are used for production and four primary colours yellow, red, black and blue from which all other colours are extracted through the process of mixing. There are total 15 workers who are paid 10000-15000 approximately. It is the first production house to print Covid posters in India. The factory was filled with a kind of pungent smell which was said to be a

industrial chemical used in inks. The owner claimed the smell of having no toxic effect.



Thirdly, we visited Khusboo Plastic Industry that produces zip lock plastic pouches. The raw materials used for production are small white grains known as LD and LLDPE which is mixed with other colours and plastics are produced. There are total 8-10 workers working on different areas i.e., forming, printing and cutting.



After we completed our 3rd industry, we had a 15 minutes break for refreshments. Then we moved towards the last factory known as

Sarkar Tiles Industry. The raw materials used are simply sand and stone which goes under a mixer machine that produces a thick mixture. The mixture is then put in silicone moulds to give the shape and is dried for 3-4 days. A chemical is mixed with the mixture which in turn produces coloured tiles. The tiles are strong and durable as it is double layered.



After the completion of all four industries all volunteers gathered and shared their personal experiences for the day and were dispersed at 3:20 pm. It was a one time experience for the volunteers and a lot of knowledgeable facts were taken home from the industrial visit.

organized by the Department. Along with the students, the teachers also enthusiastically participated in this training session. Because all are need to be fit mentally and physically.






