Detailed Report of the Special Lecture

A special lecture was organised by the Department of Political Science and History, Salesian College, Siliguri Campus on 2nd October, 2021 to commemorate the 152nd birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. The Programme started with the Prayer by Fr. Dr. Saju PT. Vice-Principal, Arts and Commerce, Salesian College, Siliguri Campus who prayed for peaceful existence and safety of entire human race in this pandemic and appealed for prevalence of Non-violence at every level to lift up the misery and crisis in the world.

After that the gathering was addressed by Principal & Rector Fr. Dr. George Thadathill, Salesian College Siliguri & Sonda Campus who in his short speech highlighted the contribution of Mahatma Gandhi and its significance in the present world. He said we must go and understand Gandhi in his own time and try to bring his inheritance in the present world. He raised his concerns regarding ideological, physical and structural violence against the backward classes and insisted adherence of Gandhian thoughts to achieve egalitarian and justice oriented society.

After a brief introduction of the speaker by Chhime Tamang, HOD, Department of Political Science, Siliguri campus, the session was handed over to the distinguished speaker, Dr. Pius Thomas Vazhappilly, HOD, Department of Philosophy, Assam University, Silchar started with highlighting the recent discussion on Gandhi we try to remember, recover, achieve relocate the Mahatma as Gandhi with all the throbbing ideals, contradiction, philosophy and messages carry with them. He further highlighted how attempts are made since 1946 to defy the practical knowledge of Gandhi on Nationalism, Non-violence, Democracy, Development and Human Rights. He stated that Gandhi's legacy goes beyond many generalised conceptualise schemes which is legacy of democracy also. Democracy to Gandhi is taking all people along and respecting each other's existence.

He further quoted Ramchandra Guha's statement "Gandhi's nationalism was democratically affirmative to the core as it was essentially pluralist and keeping the highest model of social freedom in its core. He further quoted Ram punyani who stated " Mahatma Gandhi, the father of Indian nation, has the unique distinction of leading the biggest ever mass movement in the world and leading the strong anti-colonial movement. In this direction he contributed two major tools as the basis of mass movement one is Non-Violence and other is Satyagraha." He further added Gandhi's idea of free India and conveyed that the recent debate on democracy of any form is incomplete without Gandhian Concepts.

He further highlighted some of the important debates of past and recent times which includes thinkers and social leaders like Bhim Rao Ambedkar, Jawaharlal Nehru, Arundhati Roy etc. the distinguished speaker ended his lecture with the remark, Gandhi's idea of democracy is authentic complexity and it is very important when we don't have plurality of thought and don't understand the ethical singularity, there will be essentialism and production of people of some common categories.

After the special lecture the Chairperson of the programme Prof. Tanka Bahadur Subba, HOD, Department of Anthropology, North Eastern Hill University, Shillong was invited for his key address. In his key address prof. Tanka Bahadur Subba congratulated the speaker for not only discovering mahatma in Mahatma Gandhi but discovering a wise man in Mahatma Gandhi. He praise the Speaker for referring write ups by Ramchandra Guha and many other Gandhian scholars which not only clarified the Gandhian Concepts but also explored various dimensions of Gandhian thought. He further raised concern on growing majoritarianism and questioned application of Non-violence in certain context. The chairperson distinguished the usage of No-violence by Gandhi on colonialist and colonialism and asserted some debatable instance for the uage of non-violence in the present context.

Hosting a regional Webinar in collaboration with
Humane society international

titled

“Our Hope for Farm Animals on India’s 75th Independence Day”

Privileged by the concomitant guidance from our Rector & Principal Fr. (Prof). George Thadathil and our NSS Program Officer Mr. Pinak Dey, **NSS Unit II Salesian College Siliguri Campus collaborated with Humane Society International/India** to successfully organize a webinar titled - **“Our hope for farm animals”** on the **12th of August, 2021**. **Mr Abhishek Talukdar** who is the *Campaign Coordinator for Farm Animals Protection department of HSI India* led the webinar as our resource person. The role of Humane Society International (HSI) around the globe is to promote the *human-animal bond, rescue and protect wildlife, promote animal-free testing and research, and confront cruelty to all animals in all its forms.*

The event began at 1:00 pm with 40+ participants hosted by Mr Navin Singhal (B.com Hons, 5th semester).

Fr (Prof.) George Thadathil (Rector & Principal) Salesian College Siliguri *led us into a moment of prayer* followed by his words of wisdom. The principal spoke about several individual issues around the globe related to the *catastrophic climate change, expansion of desert-area* and thereby connecting its cause to the concept of Avidya [ignorance], in humans [as expressed in the philosophic school of Vedānta]. He also reminded us of the famous dystopic novel, *George Orwell’s “Animal Farm”* which showed the brutality and anarchy humans deploy while they treat farm animals. Father Principal’s words were followed by a speech from NSS Program Officer Mr. Pinak Dey, (adding on to what was already told by the principal), he projected a melancholic dystopian reality approaching by the next century [due to climate change], caramelised in a vision that needs radical change- initiation by the youth to provide an optimistic future for our planet.

The event was then handed over to Mr Abhishek Talukdar by NSS Volunteer Miss Roshni Chettri, who introduced him.

The presentation from the resource person basically focused on the real scenario *of industrial animal agriculture being one of the worst offenders in terms of severity of suffering and number of animals affected*. More than 80 billion land animals are raised for food every year globally, and of those, the majority of the world's more than 7 billion egg laying hens and an estimated 75 million breeding cows spend most of their lives confined to cages and crates so small that they can barely move. *He also spoke about important step towards eliminating this intensive confinement is reducing the number of animals raised for food globally by changing consumer eating habits* **reducing the amount of meat, dairy, eggs and fish** thereby- increasing *plant-based alternatives*. The Q&A session led to many inquiries both from students as well as participants. Towards the end of the presentation, Mr Talukdar emphasized on the nutritional vitality and plant-based alternatives available, to make a change.

Mr Talukdar, made it clear that **HSI does not enforce a vegan diet**, but trying to *reduce the variety/number of animal-based nutrition was the take away for the participants*. He emphasized that all type of food intake was personal choice which are conditioned into our life through our society and culture [there is no fault in a non-vegetarian diet]. The solution to sustainable development as mentioned, was to reduce the number of animal-based meals per week, per day and so on.

Alternatives such as almond milk, PU leather were advocated in place of animal milk and genuine leather.






WEBINAR ON MENTAL HEALTH AND COPING WITH COVID -19

The Department of Sociology in collaboration with IQAC Salesian College Sonada, organised a Webinar on “Mental Health and Coping with COVID-19 Situation” on 12th October 2020 through the online platform Google Meet along with live streaming on YouTube.

DHoD of Sociology Assistant Prof. Samip Sinchuri was the Convenor of the first webinar of the department.

The resource person for the webinar was Ms. Ishita Sanyal, a Clinical Psychologist and Mental Health activist. She is the founder Secretary of Kolkata based NGO called Turning Point. She is the recipient of Rastriya Gaurav Award. She has also received UGC, CEC, VIDEO COMPETITION awards.

Ms. Sanyal has several research publications and has arranged a numerous plans on mental health. In addition to this she is a regular columnist in Kolkata based The Telegraph newspaper and she is continuously working to promote broad public awareness and understanding of mental health issues.

The webinar was inaugurated by Fr. Dr. George Thadathil, Principal of Salesian College Sonada & Siliguri throwing short light on mental health issues. In this session, Ms. Ishita Sanyal, talked about how mental health issues are being stigmatised by the mass population and how people in this catastrophic changes due to covid-19 pandemic are suffering from various mental diseases like depression, panic attacks, anxiety, somatoform disorder, social withdrawal.

She further highlighted the importance of IQ [Intelligent Quotient], AQ [Adversity Quotient] and EQ [Emotional Quotient] to maintain balance in life. She also emphasized that one should give equal importance to cognitive, physical and social health and promote positive outlook to mental health rather than stigmatizing the issue.

After her presentation, Ms. Sophia Rai summarised the session and this was followed by brief question and answer session. The Vice- principal Br. Jose and director of Radio Salesian Fr. C. M. Paul, made few observations.

The session ended with vote of thanks by Assistant Professor of Sociology Department Ms. Nomu Sherpa.

There were 212 candidates who had registered themselves for webinar out of which 103 participated the webinar.

REPORT

“Community, Diversity & Egalitarianism in India Society”

Organised by Department of Political Science, Sociology, History in collaboration with IQAC of Salesian College Sonada – Siliguri.

The webinar started with the prayer by Fr. Rector (Dr.) Tomy Augustine by asking God’s blessings and guidance on the seminar.

After the prayer by Father Rector Tomy, Mr Pawan Rai (HoD) Department of Political Science gave an introduction of Prof. Gail Omvedt who was a sociologist, a human right activist born in Minneapolis on 2nd of August 1941; a prolific writer and a thinker, who studied at Carleton College at UC Berkeley. She did her PhD on *Cultural Revolt in a Colonial Society: The Non-Brahman Movement in Western India, 1873-1930* from Berkeley University in 1973. She came to India for the first time in 1963 as an English tutor in Fulbright Fellowship. Prof. Omvedt’s contributions can be categorized into two, Academics and Social activism. In the field of Academics Prof. Omvedt wrote numerous books and articles, she wrote extensively on caste, class and gender. She was associated with many research projects she was also a consultant for Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO), United Nations Development Program (UNDP), [Oxfam Novib](#) (NOVIB). She also served as Dr. Ambedkar Chair Professor at National Institute of Social work and Social Sciences (NISWASS) in Orissa. She was also a Professor of Sociology at the University of Pune and Asian Guest Professor at the Nordic Institute of Asian Studies, Copenhagen. She was also a Senior Fellow at Nehru Memorial Museum and Library and also a research Director at [Krantivir Babuji Patankar Sanstha](#). As far as Social Activism is concerned Prof. Omvedt’s contribution in Social Movement in India is immense, she was a powerful force in Dalit and anti-caste movement, environment movement and farmer’s movement. She was the vanguard of rural women movement. She was active in [Shramik Mukti Dal](#), Stri Mukti Sangarsh Chalval which works on issues of abandoned women in Sangli and Satara districts of southern Maharashtra, and the Shetkari Mahila Aghadi, which works on issues of women's land rights and political power.

Prof. Omvedt wrote extensively on caste, class and gender some of the remarkable works by her are *Cultural Revolt in a Colonial Society: The NonBrahman Movement in Maharashtra (1966)*; *We Shall Smash This Prison: Indian Women in Struggle (1979)*; *Reinventing Revolution: New Social Movements in India (1993)*; *Dalits And The Democratic Revolution: Dr. Ambedkar And The Dalit Movement In Colonial India (1994)*; *Buddhism in India : Challenging Brahmanism and Caste (2003)*. For her outstanding contribution in the field of academics and social activism she was bestowed with numerous awards and fellowship some of the remarkable fellowship and awards are: Honorary Woodrow Wilson Fellowship (1964–65); Fulbright Fellowship as Tutor in English in India, (1963-1964); University of California Graduate Fellowships, (1964–65, 1965–66); American Institute of Indian Studies, Junior Fellowship for PhD research in India on “The Non-Brahman Movement in Maharashtra,” (1971); American Association of University Women, Fellowship for research on “Women’s Movement in India,” (1975); Savitribai Phule Puraskar, Padmashri Kavivarya Narayan Surve Sarvajanik Vacanalay, Nashik, (2002); Dr. Ambedkar Chetna Award, Manavwadi Rachna Manch Punjab, August (2003); ABP Majha Sanman Puraskar (2012); Matoshree Bhimabai Ambedkar Award (2012), Vitthal Ramji Shinde Award (2015); Lifetime Achievement Award from the Indian Sociological Society (2018).

After the introduction of Prof. Gail Omvedt by Mr Pawan Rai, Fr. Principal, Prof Dr George Thadathil gave a welcome address. He welcomed the spokesperson Dr. Bharat Patankar and all faculty members and students present in the webinar, while giving homage to Prof. Omvedt.

Mr Pawan Rai welcomed and gave an introduction of Dr. Bharat Patankar who was the spokesperson of this webinar. Dr. Bharat Patankar was born on 5 September 1949 in a village called [Kasegoan](#), Dist. [Sangli](#) near [Satara](#) and [Kolhapur](#) in the Indian state of [Maharashtra](#). He received his MD degree in [Gynecology](#) at [Government Medical College, Miraj](#). He is a leading activist (co-founder and President) of the left wing of [Shramik Mukti Dal](#). He was one of the founding members of Krantiba Phule Sanskritic Manch. He is a leading activist in the Badwe Hatao movement of Vidrohi Sanskritic Calval. Along with this he participated in numerous irrigation and dam movements in india along with social activism Dr. Patankar wrote numerous books and articles. Some of his outstanding works are: "Characteristics of Contemporary Caste System and its Annihilation" (2014), Maharashtra Shilpakar Nana Patil (2002); Paryayi Vikas Niti (1991). For his outstanding contribution in the field of academics and social activism, he was conferred with numerous awards: Arun LImaye Yuva Jagar Puraskar of Chhatra Bharati; Samajik Krutadnyata Puraskar, Dalit Mitra Puraskar and Baburao Bagul Gaurav Puraskar Award.

After the introduction, Dr Patankar began his lecture by dedicating it to his life companion Prof. Gail Omvedt. He thanked the organizers for holding a memorial to honor her and her work.

Dr. Pathankar started his lecture by pointing out that “community, diversity and egalitarianism in India” were present in there in ancient India.

Matrilineal clans which were called gana-sangas or Matrilineal gana-sangas, were present around Indus valley civilization and these systems functioned according to the ideas of community, diversity and egalitarianism where we can see that there was no exploitation of any kind. These gana-sangas though were matrilineal in nature they were not matriarchal, they provided a field for the growth of an egalitarian society, and there was an absence of contradictions within the community which brought about a feeling of harmony. If there had been a presence of matriarchy then a quasi-state system would have been produced, which would have led to the disintegration of the totality of the community. In India we have the history of matrilineal gana-sangas that were prevalent in the north-east of India and to some extent in Kerala. As there was absence of privatization of property in these matrilineal societies, there arose no cases of enmity between the people. The people lived in complete harmony with his surrounding environment. As these societies were grounded on decentralization of power, there was absence of hierarchy between man and women. There was no question of exploitation regarding gender, class and caste. These matrilineal society gave a classic example of a society based on community, egalitarianism and diversity.

As years went by these matrilineal gana-sangas slowly got transformed into patriarchal gana-sangas. Dr. Pathankar pointed out here that we could still find egalitarianism in these patriarchal gana-sangas, as the concept of privatization had not entered the society. The change that took place between the relationship of man and women and the absence of egalitarianism within the family slowly started to affect the egalitarianism of the gana-sanga. Women is an essential part of the community and when there was exploitation of one part of the community by the other, the egalitarianism cease to exist in the community. So, when the gana-sanga changed from matrilineal to patriarchy, the spirit of egalitarianism also got eroded.

Talking about diversity, he showed that there was diversity in both matrilineal and patriarchal ganasanga. This diversity was neither hierarchical nor exploitative. The nature of this diversity depended on the qualities of a person and his ability and skills. So, this kind of diversity of the cultures and the diversity of the skills was there but without hierarchy. However, these aspects of the patriarchal gana-sangas started getting destroyed parallelly south of the Ganges and north, later on in the southern part of India some 600-700 years after the Sangam period. In south India we can see that these

egalitarian community continued much longer than in the north and remained in the eastern part for a longer time than in the south.

With the coming of kingship there was deterioration of the patriarchal gana-sangas. Buddha who was also living in the time of patriarchal gana-sangas tried to create an egalitarian community through his Buddhist sangas because it was absent in the society of that time. Buddha mainly tried to create an egalitarian community that was based on harmony and equality. He took many principles from the matrilineal and patriarchal gana-sangas. Dr. Pathankar pointed out that women were given entry into the Sanga when they came to Buddha and questioned him about the lack of women's participation in a sanga which was egalitarian in nature. From the verses of Therigatha, we know that there was an involvement of women equally along with the men in spiritual attainment and emerging new sangas kept the elements of community, diversity and egalitarianism. Though the existing society during the period had lost its egalitarian nature, the Buddhist and Jain sangas therefore existed as islands which upheld the ideas of egalitarian diversity and community. After the sangas, we can only find some traces of these community in the tribal society in the mountainous regions, who rejected to join the society which has lost its egalitarian diversity and their sense of community cohesion. It can be seen that with the coming of globalization, the community systems held by the tribal people; the Adivasis as well as the eastern hill tribes has been affected. These recent changes have now brought us to a society that has lost its sense of community and egalitarian diversity.

Omvedt when she wrote her *Buddhism in India*, she was the first person to point out that for a thousand years from 600 BC to 600 AD there was an absence of caste system, there may have been existing forms of caste system which however were not discriminatory. It was those very thousand years that prevented caste system from getting established in India, but once the Buddhist monks were killed, the caste system started growing rapidly. One can take the example of Buddha's peaceful intervention into the dasa-shudra slavery which was existing in those days, which led to the abolition of slavery. Here, Buddha can be seen as a reformist who showed the possibility of bringing into practice a society which is based on egalitarian community, without the use of violence.

Through this observation we come towards a question about the needed reestablishment of an egalitarian community that values diversity and harmony among its members. This possibility of establishing such a community was Prof. Gail Omvedt's dream, as stated by Dr. Pathankar. This "dream" towards which Prof. Omvedt worked throughout her whole life was also the dream that was held by Buddha, Babasaheb Ambedkar, Phule and the saint poets like Kabir. Dr. Pathankar lucidly explained how Prof. Omvedt through her analysis has put forward the idea that theorists like Ambedkar and Phule

were also trying to reach an alternative society which is based on egalitarian ideals which protects the idea of the freedom of diversity.

Gail Omvedt's book "Seeking Begumpura", which is based on Saint Ravidas's poem; who imagined of an egalitarian society with diversity, which was also based on the idea of community cohesion. Prof. Omvedt wanted to show that "Begumpura" the city or country without "gum" or "dukkha" (sorrow) is possible even today. Through the analysis of Buddha's intervention in the dasa-shudra slavery we can see that this can only be possible with a unanimous decision of all people who have decided to change this society. This is a question of changing the exploitative system and is not a suggestion of a fight between one majority section and a minority. Dr. Pathankar clearly points out in his words that "it is a question of liberating everyone from the clutches of the existing systems and making everybody more humane." This was the dream which was bought forward by Buddha, saint poets and Ambedkar. This was also the view brought forward strongly by Gail in her book "Seeking Begumpura". The real homage we can give to Gail Omvedt is by seeking Begumpura and reinstating these three aspects of community, diversity and egalitarianism into the creation of a more humane society.

The lecture was followed by an interactive session of questionnaire which was very informative. The webinar helped the students and the faculty the know more about the works of Prof. Gail. Omvedt and it made conscious of our responsibility to the establishment of the egalitarian community with diversity.

The session ended with a very thoughtful vote of thanks from Mr Samip Sinchuri (HoD) Department of Sociology.

Prof Ananth gave a descriptive explanation to each of the question which was put forward. The session went for about 45 minutes.

Lecture Series on Literary and Cultural Theories

Salesian College Siliguri Campus: The Department of English, Salesian College Siliguri Campus, in collaboration with IQAC took an initiative to conduct a series of online lectures on Literary and Cultural Theories during the academic year of 2020-21. With the onset of global pandemic, there has been a shift in teaching-learning process. In order to cope with this shift and to give the new experience of learning more variety and freshness from the regular monotonous online classes, the Department made an active effort in inviting well known personalities in the field academics and theories from all over the world to enlighten and interact with the students, albeit virtually. The series spanned over four months beginning from September and ending in December of 2020. There were six lectures conducted on various fields of Literary and Cultural Theories in total.

The Series was inaugurated on 19th September, 2020 with its first lecture on Reader Response Theory titled: *Responsibility of the Reader in the Era of Reader Response Theory*. The resource person of the day was Dr. Agniv Ghosh, Assistant Professor, Department of Modern Indian Languages and Literary Studies, University of Delhi. Dr. Ghosh broadly traced the theory from the time of its development and its present condition and the responsibility of the reader as an active component in the meaning-generation of a text.

The second lecture was organised on 10th October, 2020, titled: *Act of Reading as Multiple, Singular and Contingent Moments: Thinking Otherwise*. Dr. Rajlakshmi Ghosh, Assistant Professor, iLead College, Kolkata was the speaker for the day. Dr. Ghosh's lecture focused on the study of the act of "Reading" itself. She made references to Deconstructive reading and ideas of important thinkers and theorists like Derrida and Heidegger to elucidate on the subject that she was discussing.

On the 17th of the same month another interesting lecture on Deconstruction was organised. This time, the speaker was Pramod K. Nayar, a well known figure in the field of Literary Studies. He is an Assistant Professor in the Department of English, University of Hyderabad. His lecture was titled: *Nature/Culture/Nature/Culture*. Nayar, very lucidly and, in a very student-friendly manner, explained the workings of deconstruction of a text by deconstructing *The Solitary Reaper*, a popular poem by the Romantic poet, William Wordsworth.

The fourth was a lecture on Postcolonialism, held on 12th November, 2020. The speaker of this webinar was Professor Bill Ashcroft, a highly regarded figure and thinker in the field of Postcolonialism who has made significant contributions to the field through his works, of which *The Empire Writes Back* is notably, the most popular. He is an Emeritus Professor at the School of English, Media and Performing Arts, University of New South Wales. Professor Ashcroft introduced and explained postcolonial concepts like the Utopia in his lecture.

The last lecture of the series was one on Lacanian Psychoanalysis held on the 4th of December, 2020. Dr. Sigi Jottkandt, Associate Professor, School of Media and Performing

Arts, University of New South Wales was the resource person for the lecture. Dr. Jottkandt explained the working of Psychoanalysis, developing it from the ideas of thinkers like Freud and Lacan, and also in association to the works of the Surrealist artist Rene Magritte. She further extended her lecture into discussing about psychoanalysis as a tool for the literary criticism.

This was the conclusion of the Series of Lectures on Literary and Cultural Theories. All the lectures were held on the online platform, GoogleMeet and were an hour or an hour and a half long lectures which were followed by active interactive sessions. The lectures were attended by, not only the Undergraduate and Postgraduate student of the English Department of the College but also, several scholars and students of other universities participated in them with over 80 participants in each of them. The series was a success in many ways: the students got a chance to listen to prominent persons speak and interact with them and the participants were also introduced to several new ideas and concepts which will likely spark newer questions and curiosity for further search and study.

Report on an Educational Trip to Rabindra Smriti Bhawan, Mungpoo

20 February 2021

As a part of the blended mode of teaching-learning, the Department of Education, Salesian College Siliguri, conducted/organised an educational trip to Rabindra Smriti Bhawan (Rabindra Museum) located at Mungpoo, Darjeeling district, West Bengal on 20 February 2021. The main purpose behind the visit to Rabindra Museum was to develop an insight about the enormous contributions done by Tagore in the field of education besides breaking the tedium of online classes. With the objective to make the educational trip an effective one, a scouting was conducted by the faculty members of the Department dated 15 February 2021. A detailed outline of the educational trip stating the objectives, expected outcomes and activities to be done by students was circulated by the Head of the Department, Ms. Priya Topno, on 18 February 2021.

A group of 20 students along with 5 faculty members joined the educational trip. The reporting time for all was 8 am to the college. Adhering to the Covid-19 safety rules, the No Objection Certificate (NoC) was sought from the respective parents/guardians of the students. By 08:30 am NoCs were collected from the students which was then followed by a short prayer by Fr (Prof) George Thadathil, SDB, Principal & Rector, Salesian College invoking the blessing of the Lord for a safe and successful journey. After the insightful words from the Principal, breakfast was given to everyone along with a set of questionnaires to each student as a part of their survey activity. The journey for the educational trip started at 9 am and reached the spot around 10:30 am.

As all the learners were very keen and interested to explore the Museum, Mr. Shishir Rahut, the local guide cum caretaker of the Bhawan since 2000, guided the students and explained to them about the historical importance of the Bhawan. Mr. Rahut stated that “Tagore was indeed the one who brought in actual freedom in the lives of the local people.” The students penned down all the historical information given by Mr. Rahut as a part of their survey activity. The explanation given by Mr. Rahut helped the students to gain an insight about the original works done by Tagore during his stay at Mungpoo. As the students were exploring the Bhawan, the personal belongings of Tagore such as his paints and paintings, medicines, newspapers read by him, his resting chair, his writing desk and chair helped them to know more about Tagore as a person.

After gathering many historical information and importance of the Bhawan from Mr. Rahut, the students started writing their survey activities. Reflecting upon Tagore’s lifestyle, works and contribution the group left the Bhawan at around 01:30 pm. On the way back to campus the students and the faculty members stopped for lunch at Suntalay and reached college at 4 pm. All the students had a very interactive and informative get together after many months of lockdown. The purpose to inculcate family spirit, fellow feeling and socializing together as a Department was rightly executed in an effective and efficient manner. The trip to Rabindra Smriti Bhawan was indeed a wonderful experience with full of historical knowledge.





Mr. Joseph Rai, a Business Journalist with 10 years of experience as Special Correspondent for VCCircle, Hindustan Times, delivered his lecture on 'Business Journalism: Start-up Coverage in India'.

In the on-line lecture attended by both students and professors of Salesian College Sonada and Siliguri campuses, Joseph Rai gave a very holistic approach to the subject matter and brought to the forefront many new concepts of business journalism. He concluded his lecture quoting George Orwell, " Journalism is printing what someone else does not want printed; everything else is public relations. "

On the same occasion, Prof. Dipen Roy, Department of commerce, presented his new book for release, 'Managerial Microeconomics for Commerce Management CMA & Other Business Studies' to the august gathering.

Fr. Dr. James Chacko, Rector of Salesian Studentate and Fr. Prof. George Thadathil, Principal of Salesian College, released the book after a short introduction about the author and the book.

Verzotto memorial lecture is an annual event in honour of Fr. Joseph Verzotto, a Salesian priest and a great philosopher. He was also a biographer, literary essayist, film critique, a translator and a religious instructor. He died in Kolkata in 2009 at the age of 82.

Report on the Webinar organized by Department of History, Salesian College, Siliguri

A one-day webinar on “Language and Literature as Perspectives in Understanding the Darjeeling Hills” organized by Department of History, Salesian College, Siliguri on 23rd August 2020 at 4.00 pm through Virtual Mode on Google Meet. The Conveners of the Webinar were Miss Manisha Pradhan HoD, Dept. of History and Mrs. Deepti Naidu, Assistant Professor, Dept. of History. The Webinar was started by the opening notes by the Moderator Miss Manisha Pradhan and then welcome address and Introduction of the Speaker was given by Fr. Dr. Babu Joseph Vice Principal, Morning Session. The key Speaker of the Webinar was Dr. Swatahsiddha Sarkar Professors from many respected Colleges including our college and the students had participated in the Webinar. There were around 55 participants all together. Dr Sarkar started his lecture with an Introduction to the Language and Literature as a perspective is multidisciplinary in nature and while historicizing language and literature in Darjeeling hills there are many literary figures, cultural critics, anthropologists, political scientists, philosophers and the historians have attributed with space and time. He further illustrated saying that language as a perspective is based on a mutual presupposition that both language and consciousness share as a social product. It is not language that gives birth to our consciousness. He placed his argument that linguistic and literary domain is as dynamic as social and language arises out of the need, necessity of social interaction and it is essentially a social phenomenon.

Literature as a perspective the authenticity of literature is to make us ‘see’, ‘perceive’, ‘feel’ something which eludes reality. He gave examples of the novel *Bhramar*, or the short story *Pahar ra Khola*, or for that matter the collection of poems like *Kinara Ko Awaz Haru*, *Dahine Bato*, and *Arko Laskar*, they make us see, perceive, and feel something which alludes to reality. Each of these cases are reflective of certain ideas, embedded in certain ideas, and preaching certain ideas. After giving a comparative study he elaborated and concluded the session saying that both language and literature are ideological. While language is viewed as the result of ideological emanations, literature is embedded into it and reflects on it rather spontaneously. There is therefore congruence between the way life is lived and the way life is reflected upon. This as a perspective can help us take a position on the phenomena of ‘language of contestation’ implying the growing politicization of linguistic cleavage and the predominance of micro community identities premised on minority language claims. There was an interactive Question and Answer Session where most of the Students participated. The Webinar ended with the words of Observations by Fr. Dr. George Thadathil, Principal Salesian College, Siliguri and followed by vote of Thanks by Mrs. Deepti Naidu, Assistant Professor, Salesian College. Overall the Webinar was a successful one

Webinar on Buddhist Meditation- Post Traditional Meaning and Method

As part of a series on ‘Religious Practices in the Himalayan Spaces’ Salesian College Siliguri hosted a webinar on the topic ‘Buddhist Meditation- Post Traditional Meaning and Method’ on the 23rd of October. Hindol Chakraborty, Assistant Professor Department of English, opened the session with a prayer song, followed by an opening remarks by Fr. Dr. George Thadathil Principal Salesian College and President AIACHE. He spoke about the Mystic and the Transhuman, and stated that “meditation leads to self-exploration, whereas technology lead to self-transformation” and one must learn from the other.

Miss Ranu Sherpa, Assistant Professor department of English introduced the guest speaker Dr. Pius V Thomas, Professor at Assam University’s Department of Philosophy. Speaking on the topic he discussed the philosophical, socio-cultural, ethical, and spiritual significance of Buddhist meditation from a post-traditional perspective.

Dr. Thomas elaborated the subject, saying that the ultimate goal of meditation in Buddhism is to realize *Sunyata*, or emptiness, which is attained through self-negation and compassion. Unlike other religions, such as Hinduism, specifically Vedanta, where there is no room for the other, Buddhism, according to him, acknowledges the other.

In Buddhism, he says “mediation is ultimately going beyond the self in order to transcend the reductionist and un-dialogical self and self-sameness” and concludes

that “mediation ultimately becomes compassion.” He observes that post traditional understanding of meditation is ultimately compassion.

Dr. Thomas goes on to describe how, from a Buddhist perspective, meditation may be viewed as a therapeutic, political, ethical, and cultural instrument, as well as a symbol of coexistence on multiple levels.

Professor T.B Subba of the Department of Anthropology at North Eastern Hill University, who moderated the session, applauded Dr. Thomas for presenting a well-researched topic and opened the floor for question and answer session.

David Alexander Palmar, Professor in the Institute of Humanities and Social Science and department of Sociology, University of Hong Kong was also present and asked some thought provoking questions to the speaker.

Making his observation, Fr. Dr. George Thadathil, said that meditation as compassion and compassion as meditation is an insightful observation that makes space for post-religious religion and post-secular secularity.

While reviewing the journey so far Dr. Thadathil commented that it is important to bring ‘religion into the academic discourse’ and these series of webinars, as part of the research project on Religious Practices in the Himalayan Spaces, was a small step towards it.

The session concluded with a vote of thanks given by Miss. Monica Rana, Assistant Professor Department of English.

The webinar held online on Google meet, was co-organised by the University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong, China, and St. Anthony’s College Shillong, and co-sponsored by Brinfaith. It is the final in a series on the theme of “Mountains and Minorities, Meditation and Monasteries, Medicine and Mendicants.”




