
Vision: An attempt to help the students make an informed career choice.

3. To inform the students about the eligibility requirements needed for the various posts.




Tasks planned for the day

MCJH FACTSHALA WORKSHOP

January 2020, Siliguri : The Department of Mass Communication and Journalism organized a workshop on the topic 'a fight against misinformation and empowering citizens through news and information literacy' from Factshala India.


The speaker for the event was Dr. Shourini Banerjee, certified professional trainer (FACTSHALA, news and information literacy initiative by DataLEADS with support from google.org) and academician, Dr. Banerjee has completed her PhD research on "gender and masculinity in television commercials-a critical study", she has also published and presented multiple papers in national and international conferences.

The event commenced with an opening speech by Fr. (Dr.) George Thadathil (Principal, Salesian College), father spoke about the importance of differentiating between news that is derived and news that is concocted, he said "one's proposition must not harm one's right to be".

Therafter, Dr. Banerjee began her talk with how one can develop independent thinking and verify content by fact checking. "Information empowers but over load cripples" expressed Dr. Banerjee. The session focused on the sources of information, why good information is important and how it affects socio-economic and political decisions.

Dr. Banerjee then continued on the dangers of misinformation, bias, manipulation on social media and the effects of being 'confined in a box of content'. She elaborated on filter bubbles, echo chamber and types of propaganda that exists in the current world. Dr. Banerjee concluded her speech by highlighting the importance of critical thinking and ways to improve it with multiple interactive exercises followed by a question and answer session.

The session then concluded leaving the participants with new perspective on news and information.

This motivation and dedication towards fulfilling our motive, sowed a seed in each one of us to create a platform wherein all the aspiring entrepreneurs of the world come together as one, which yielded the Yggdrasil, ENSPIRE - Ideate to Innovate.

ENSPiRE 2021 was a 3-day Global Level Inter Collegiate Entrepreneurial fest that, conducted on 14th, 15th & 16th May which hosted 8 special events in various spheres of the corporate world along with other activities to challenge the intelligence, critical acumen and entrepreneurial abilities of participants from all across the world.

More than 1900 students from 200+ institutions registered for this fest and the winners were awarded with crate-full of surprises along with a total Cash prizes worth INR 25000 and round-trip tickets to Singapore.

The fest also witnessed the support of eminent personalities like Mr. Gaurav Sundaramanan, Cricket analyst, ESPNCRICINFO , Miss Priyanka Madnani, Founder and CEO - Easy to Pitch, Mr. Shyam Sekhar, Mr. Rakesh Mishra, Mr. Abhimanyu Sikarwar, Mr. Krishna Tunga, Mr. Vishal Kumar and many more who graced the event in the capacity of members of the panel which itself added to the success of this venture.

Herewith is a detailed account of all the events of this Fest.

INDRAPRASTHA- THE STARTUP BUZZ

Chase the vision, not the money, the money will end up following you

Indraprastha- The Start-Up Buzz. was an event meant to bring the best out of such visionaries. Since the advent of the 21st century, success has always been synonymous with vision and the ability to create. The focus on living one's dreams has led to the emergence of people like Vijay Shekhar Sharma (Paytm) and Bhavish Aggarwal (Ola).

This event was one to bring to life the unimaginable and plan to create something that benefits the world at large. It is rightly said Why to be an employee when you can be the CEO. The same statement has led to a surge in the number of startups growing and glowing all across the country and hence the event was titled Indraprastha- The Start-up Buzz.

Enspire 2021 was a 3-day global online fest conducted on 14th, 15th and 16th May 2021. Indraprastha was held on the second day of the fest (i.e. 15th May) from 3:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. via a zoom call. The event witnessed the participation of a staggering 163 teams. Participants shared their visions towards their goal of becoming the next big entrepreneur in the form of a presentation and 10 teams had prepared the best presentation to cross the first round conducted as prelims where the participants had to prepare and submit a presentation and reach the finale.

The experience and knowledge that the jury brought to the event was like the Midas touch to the whole event. The jury consisted of Mr Rakesh Mishra, a startup expert and strategy coach. He is also the Founder Director of startupgameplanning.com. The second jury member was Mr Shyam Sekar who is a Startup coach and Startup accelerator. He is also the founder of Startup Xperts and Voxit Media Tech. Their expertise made the event a learning experience for all the participants and the viewers vouched to participate in such events whenever they get the next chance to.

The final round of Indraprastha was filled with intense moments as the judges extracted the best out of the participants by asking them questions and giving them deep insights into their respective business plans. After a very close competition an individual Team Bliscare of Chinmaya Naik was declared as winners and another Team Arogya of Anjali & Anisha Singh was declared as the runners up.

It was a great learning experience for all the participants and the motive of the event was fulfilled.

ASHWATHAMA- THE BEST AMONG ALL

"By failing to prepare, one is actually preparing to fail."

One never knows about the storm that she/he has to face, especially when it comes to the corporate world. One always needs to be on her/his heels and conquer unpropitious situations to emerge as the "best", one who doesn't succumb to situations like the immortal Ashwathama.

The unique profiles given to the participants added spice to the entire show.

In the end, Ann D Mathew emerged as the ultimate warrior, winning a cash prize of rupees 2000. She truly flaunted the Ashwathama in her and left us all amazed.

Out of these only the top 10 team made it to the finals and the rest were eliminated in the prelims conducted on 11th May, 2021.

The judges for Sanjeevani were Smt. Natasha Agarwal & Smt. Seema Baid. Natasha Agarwal is a qualified chartered accountant working as the finance head in a hospitality company. She is a young entrepreneur with an environmentally concerned mindset. Seema Baid is an experienced and simple lady who is the co-founder of Herbice India. It is a wellness and immunity building brand and also served as the wellness partner for Enspire 2021.

Both the judges were very impressed by the ideas that were presented during Sanjeevani. The judges gave some really good advice to the participants to help develop their ideas and at the same time were acute and sharp in their judgement.

The final round of Sanjeevani saw some immense competition of the highest level as all the participants came up with brilliant business ideas for a sustainable future. After very close competition, Team Anushashan01 from Christ University, Bengaluru which consisted of, emerged as the winners while an individually registered team "Greenies" secured the runners up position.

Environmental protection has undoubtedly become a common understanding and development strategy of all countries around the globe. The overall feedback of Sanjeevani was that it had been a very learning and noble experience for everyone who was a part of it. It would not be an overstatement to say that Sanjeevani achieved what it set out to achieve.

The participants were supposed to rebrand the deflated company given to them and come up with a whole new marketing strategy in the form of a ppt and present it to the jury, followed by a question-and-answer round by our honourable judges.

The judges for this event were Mr. Abhimanyu Sikarwar, founder Ottoedge India and Ottoedge UAE and Mr. Vishal Kumar, founder LWT academy. The round went smoothly throughout with increasing zeal and utmost interaction between the judges, participants and of course the organisers.

The round ended by 3pm on the same day with the closing ceremony.

After a series of presentations and mind boggling questions by the jury, finally the REAL MARKETEEER of Prachaar was chosen. Team IPPR98 with its members Dhairya Chandwani and Tanisha Dhingra won the winners position and team Ashwamedha01 with its team members Tanvi Mundra and Monika Karnani won the runners-up position.

This successful event indeed set another benchmark in the books of EDC!

BAZAAR- THE KRYPTO KING

There aren't a lot of places where you find people from different walks of life, yet there's one place where such people walk together. Bazaar – The Krypto King, an online trading event, organised by the Entrepreneurship Development Cell proved to be just that.

Bazaar witnessed nearly 400 investors ready to twist trends, plot prices and change currencies. The Bazaar was open for a period of 4 days starting from 13th May till 16th May. The first three days of the Bazaar focussed on the trades related to cryptocurrencies followed by a single day trade of equity shares of different companies.

The trades relating to cryptocurrencies were conducted through Roostoo application and the investors were allotted 50,000 USD each for making trade and transactions. The top 15 teams who had the highest portfolio at the end of three days of trading qualified for the final round. The final round relating to equity shares were dealt through google forms wherein investors were allotted 5,00,000 INR and could buy and sell shares of the listed companies.

The finale of 15 participants saw neck to neck competition. Everyone was better than their competitors. It was conducted on 16th of May from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p. m and finally after a lot of leader-board ups and downs, an individual participant with the name Suraj Agarwal emerged as the winner of bazaar and Madhav Mahajan as the runners up. The experience as registered in the feedback was a cherishing one for each and every participant.

The Bazaar poised just one simple question to the investors: With limitless transactions daily, would their transaction be just one of many or whether they had the power to change the face of the Bazaar? However, we believe that the Bazaar teaches a lot more than question but no one gets their trade secrets out just yet because they say the Bazaar has ears too. With 12 years of in-hand experience in this field, he has consulted the Champion West Indies team for World T20 2016. He has also represented RCB in the player auction of IPL 2015.

The final round of Saudagar saw some immense competition as all the participants had a great strategy planned in their minds. After a very close competition, an individual registered team named "Tharaiyasatham" comprising of Vaitheeshwar Prakash and Vishal Ravi emerged victorious while another individual registered team named "Corona Virus" comprising of Akshit Taneja and Rahul Surana secured the runners up position.

Both the judges were really impressed by all the data and research work all the participating teams had put forward. The overall feedback of Saudagar was that it had been a very learning experience for everyone who has had some interest in the field of cricket.

The preliminary round of the quiz was conducted over Google Form wherein the participants were given 12 minutes to attempt 20 questions. Following the completion of which, the top 8 teams were shortlisted for the final showdown.

The finals were a 3-round quiz consisting of 24 questions. In what was a highly competitive and thrilling affair, Team IPCH15 of Vedanta Dalal and Adit Sanjanwala were crowned champions with

220 points while Team IPCH137 of Sanat Dayani and Rahil Arora came in a close second with 210 points.

The questions for the event were prepared by an EDC member, Master Sagar Agarwal, who is a quizzing enthusiast with over 10 years of experience. He was assisted in this endeavour by fellow members Master Aman Agarwal and Miss Neha Chowdhary.

Quizzing is not just a mind sport that tests the intellect of the participants, but it is also the celebration of knowledge. To sum up, this event was complete enough to fulfil everyone's "hunger for knowledge."

Hosting a regional Webinar in collaboration with
Humane society international

titled

“Our Hope for Farm Animals on India’s 75th Independence Day”

Privileged by the concomitant guidance from our Rector & Principal Fr. (Prof). George Thadathil and our NSS Program Officer Mr. Pinak Dey, **NSS Unit II Salesian College Siliguri Campus collaborated with Humane Society International/India** to successfully organize a webinar titled - **“Our hope for farm animals”** on the **12th of August, 2021**. **Mr Abhishek Talukdar** who is the *Campaign Coordinator for Farm Animals Protection department of HSI India* led the webinar as our resource person. The role of Humane Society International (HSI) around the globe is to promote the *human-animal bond, rescue and protect wildlife, promote animal-free testing and research, and confront cruelty to all animals in all its forms.*

The event began at 1:00 pm with 40+ participants hosted by Mr Navin Singhal (B.com Hons, 5th semester).

Fr (Prof.) George Thadathil (Rector & Principal) Salesian College Siliguri *led us into a moment of prayer* followed by his words of wisdom. The principal spoke about several individual issues around the globe related to the *catastrophic climate change, expansion of desert-area* and thereby connecting its cause to the concept of Avidya [ignorance], in humans [as expressed in the philosophic school of Vedānta]. He also reminded us of the famous dystopic novel, *George Orwell’s “Animal Farm”* which showed the brutality and anarchy humans deploy while they treat farm animals. Father Principal’s words were followed by a speech from NSS Program Officer Mr. Pinak Dey, (adding on to what was already told by the principal), he projected a melancholic dystopian reality approaching by the next century [due to climate change], caramelised in a vision that needs radical change- initiation by the youth to provide an optimistic future for our planet.

The event was then handed over to Mr Abhishek Talukdar by NSS Volunteer Miss Roshni Chettri, who introduced him.

The presentation from the resource person basically focused on the real scenario *of industrial animal agriculture being one of the worst offenders in terms of severity of suffering and number of animals affected*. More than 80 billion land animals are raised for food every year globally, and of those, the majority of the world's more than 7 billion egg laying hens and an estimated 75 million breeding cows spend most of their lives confined to cages and crates so small that they can barely move. *He also spoke about important step towards eliminating this intensive confinement is reducing the number of animals raised for food globally by changing consumer eating habits* **reducing the amount of meat, dairy, eggs and fish** thereby- increasing *plant-based alternatives*. The Q&A session led to many inquiries both from students as well as participants. Towards the end of the presentation, Mr Talukdar emphasized on the nutritional vitality and plant-based alternatives available, to make a change.

Mr Talukdar, made it clear that **HSI does not enforce a vegan diet**, but trying to *reduce the variety/number of animal-based nutrition was the take away for the participants*. He emphasized that all type of food intake was personal choice which are conditioned into our life through our society and culture [there is no fault in a non-vegetarian diet]. The solution to sustainable development as mentioned, was to reduce the number of animal-based meals per week, per day and so on.

Alternatives such as almond milk, PU leather were advocated in place of animal milk and genuine leather.

The vote of thanks was given by Akash Bansal (B. Com Hons, 5th semester). Participants were finally asked to fill the feedback form and the webinar ended at around 2:30 p.m.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Mr. Bikramjit Chandra, coordinator of the event.






The talk was mainly aimed for the students of the 6th semester before they start their classes from the next day. These students have the subject ‘Point-set Topology’ in the paper DSE 3A. The talk was delivered by Dr Gangotryi Sorcar, Temporary Asst Prof, University of Delaware, USA. As informed by Mr Paul while introducing the speaker to the house, Dr Sorcar finished her PhD from the State University of New York, Binghamton and had orchestrated different research and teaching posts at the Ohio State University and the Hebrew University, Israel in the past.

Webinar on Entrepreneurship and Family Business



Abstract:

The talk encompassed basics in nanotechnology taking into consideration the intriguing properties of nano-materials/nanoparticles and their application. In addition, the state of the art characterization techniques to probe the physiochemical properties of nanomaterials were also discussed.

Resource person:

Dr. Amretashis Sengupta (SERB Research Scientist at the University of North Bengal)

About Dr. Sengupta:

Dr. Sengupta is currently a SERB Research Scientist at the University of North Bengal. He has a number of varied interests in the field of nanotechnology and materials science but is primarily focused on the properties of low dimensional systems and their possible integration into Li/Na ion batteries and solar cells. He originally did his Masters in Physics from the University of North Bengal before branching into nanotechnology with an M.Tech and a Ph.D. in Engineering from Jadavpur University. He has done a significant amount of post-doctoral work: both nationally in the Indian Institute of Science, and internationally in the University of Bremen in Germany and the University of Glasgow in the UK. He has also co-authored an introductory textbook on nanotechnology titled "Introduction to Nano - Basics to Nanoscience and Nanotechnology".

Summary of the webinar:

Dr. Sengupta, introduced the how and why the properties of matter changes as we scale down their dimension from bulk to nanometer range. He presented the different methods on how one can synthesize nanomaterials. The lecture indeed carried a unique flavor as Dr. Sengupta explained the practical applications of nanomaterials and how technology can transcend to newer heights once the commercial production of nanomaterials become feasible.

In parallel, he also explained about the working of different state-of-the-art characterizing instruments such as X-ray diffractometer, Scanning Electron Microscope etc. Overall, the lecture was oriented towards the undergraduate students.

The presentation was hosted by Mr. Bikramjit Chanda (Asst. Prof. – Physics), Ms. Sujata Sinha (Asst. Prof. – Physics) was incharge of Q&A session, Mr. Mayukh Majumdar (Asst. Prof. – Physics) gave thoughts for the talk and Dr. Prajwal Chettri (Asst. Prof. – Physics) gave vote of thanks to the Speaker as well as to the audiences.



RAPPORTEUR’S REPORT

01/12/2020

A workshop was organised by the Department of Education, Salesian College Siliguri on the theme ‘Research Proposal and Report writing’ on 1st December 2020 over Google meet platform and YouTube. Around 50 participants were present for the workshop. The session began approximately at 12:10 pm and extended up to 2:15pm. The resource person for the session was Dr. Savita Mishra, Principal of Vidyasagar college of Education Phansidewa, West Bengal. The workshop began with a short introduction of the esteemed resource person by Ms. Ranita Chakraborty. This was followed by the welcome address by Fr. (Prof.) George Thadathil, Principal, Salesian College.

Before the presentation, a brief framework was provided with respect to the research and process of writing, followed by Dr. Savita Mishra’s discussion on how to identify the research problem. She also mentioned the area on which one is willing to do the research. In this context the resource person drew the attention of participants on how to write a research proposal. She discussed on the structure of a research proposal, elaborating on the different aspects of the proposal. Speaking of the process in research writing, Dr. Mishra shared her experience while writing her Ph.D. thesis. While elaborating on the steps of the research proposal the presentation mainly focused on the introduction, literature review, rationale of the study, statement of the problem, objectives of the study, hypothesis of the study, scope and delimitation, methodology, sample, tools, techniques of data analysis. She also discussed about importance of abstract and what should be taken into consideration while writing an abstract.

In conclusion, Dr. Savita Mishra emphasised on the different styles of reference writing such as those of APA, Chicago and the MLA referencing style. Apart from proper referencing, the resource person also drew the attention of the participants to the need to avoid plagiarism at all cost while preparing the research report. In this regard, Dr. Mishra presented an in detailed discussion on the various ways to avoid plagiarism and the need for proofreading before submitting the final research report.

Following the presentation, there was an activity session in which the participants were asked to prepare a research proposal on any topic of their choice. During the course of this activity session, many queries were raised by the participants to the resource person regarding the various aspects of the research process. Towards the end of the activity session, the participants presented their research proposal. This was followed by the closing remark by Fr (Dr) George Chempakathinal, Vice Principal, Arts/Humanities Stream, Salesian College Siliguri. The workshop ended with a vote of the thanks that was presented by Ms. Priya Topno, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Salesian College Siliguri.



